

HARAMBEE ART CONTEST

St. Michael's Africa Project – Session IV

Eligibility:

- Open to all students – JK to Grade 12.
- Each artist (or guardian) must give written permission for the Africa Project committee to use and display his/her work.

Description:

- Submissions must be original works of art.
- Art work should be no smaller than 8 x 11 and no larger than 11x 17.
- Subject matter should reflect the School Sisters of Notre Dame Children Outreach in Nyalieng'a or activities that have taken place here at St. Michael's or the parish schools.
- Suggestions include the children and their lives, Sister Mara's visit, the Solidarity Pole, guest speakers, the bulletin stories, Harambee Book Club, fundraising activities etc.
- Please note that the children of Nyalieng'a do not see lions, elephants and giraffes in their daily life activities.

Categories:

- The art work will be divided into categories depending on the artist's age.

Due Date:

- Art work may be submitted at the church in the lower vestibule outside the Parish Centre on **Saturday November 12th between 9 am and Noon.**

View and Vote:

- After each of the masses on November 12-13th, parishioners will be invited to the Parish Centre to view the artwork and vote for their favourites.

Prizes:

- There will be a prize in each category for the art with the most votes.

Other:

- The twelve most suitable entries will be used to create a 2012 calendar. The calendar will be used as a fund-raiser for the Harambee project. In order for the calendar to be produced, at least 25 calendars must be pre-ordered.
- To share with our partners in Nyalieng'a, suitable artwork will be published on the Africa Project webpage.
